<b>A Level: Unit 2 Writing</b>  <b>Written exam: 2 hours</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 80 marks in total</li><li>• 20% of A-level</li></ul>	1x 300 word essay based on the novel studied. 1x 300 word essay based on the film analysed.
<b>A Level: Speaking</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Oral exam: 21–23 minutes (including 5 minutes preparation time)</b></li><li>• 60 marks in total</li><li>• 30% of A-level</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Discussion of a sub-theme with the discussion based on a stimulus card (5–6 minutes). The student studies the card for 5 minutes at the start of the test (25 marks).</li><li>• Presentation (2 minutes) and discussion (9–10 minutes) of individual research project (35 marks).</li></ul>
