

Notre Dame School complies with its legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997 (the so called 'Baker Clause').

Students in years 8-13:

- Find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme. This provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point. In particular students are informed during their KS3 Work Related Learning programme within PSHE, Employability lessons in Year 11 and during Learn for Life lessons in Year 12.
- Hear about a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options evenings, assemblies and taster events. Students in KS4 are encouraged to attend local events such as the Skills South West Show where local training providers are represented. Students in Year 12 also learn about the local apprenticeship and foundation degree offer through presentations given by local providers. Students also receive directly from the Local Authority information concerning transition options at post-14.
- Understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses. They receive support and advice in terms of completing applications for post-16 and post-18 opportunities. This is done through form tutors, teachers of PSHE, our IAG team, UCAS team and our impartial CSW careers advisor.
- Are encouraged to use the Careers Library which is situated within the main body of the school library. Prospectuses and other information on local training providers of all key stages is displayed here when it is received in to school.
